Due to the changes in the law concerning possession of handguns and travel with guns that occurred with the 1994 Crime Bill, it is necessary that a "Consent for Possession of Handgun by Juvenile" form be completed by the parent or legal guardian of any competitor under the age of 18. If your child is competing in the US Nationals, we must receive a signed form with the slot. It is also important that the child have a copy of the form with them while competing or in possession of your firearm.

If you are not able to be present during the competition, The Consent for Possession of Handgun by Juvenile, Appointment of Temporary Guardian form is to be completed, signed and returned along with the other consent form.

You will not be able to compete if the Consent for Possession of Handgun by Juvenile form is not completed and signed by the start of competition. If you feel that you will be unable to get your consent form to us by match registration, you may bring it, fully completed and signed, with you to the competition and present it at that time.
